COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

NOTE: Friday, March 17 was the second committee deadline. Bills had to be heard in all policy committee(s) to which they were referred in at least one body in order to progress.

MONDAY, MARCH 13

GOVERNOR'S SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET

Governor Dayton introduced his supplemental budget proposal on March 17. This comes after the State's February Budget Forecast showed the state with a **\$1.65 billion budget surplus**, and builds on the Governor's previously released budget proposal.

This proposal would invest an **additional \$100 million** in voluntary Pre-K on top of the \$75 million the Governor previously proposed, bringing Governor Dayton's total proposed investments in voluntary Pre-K to **\$175 million this session**. This investment would provide access to voluntary Pre-K for 12,900 more Minnesota 4-year-olds and their families.
