



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE | May 2, 2017

SPENDING TARGETS

House and Senate Leaders announced that they had reached agreements on spending targets for each bill on **Friday, April 28**. This includes a decision to take the Senate position of **\$18.57 billion** on E-12 education, and a compromise position of **\$13.82 billion** in spending for health and human services. The joint targets include **\$1.15 billion** for tax relief.

Now that targets have been established, conference committees will work quickly during the week of May 1 to come to agreements and bring bills to the floor for votes. House and Senate leaders have stated a goal of Thursday, May 4 to have a report to the Governor.

CONFERENCE COMMITTEES

Now As a reminder, House and Senate staff have created comprehensive <u>"side by side" documents</u> that describe the narrative content of each bill and how they align or are different, and budget <u>tracking sheets</u> that indicate how the House, Senate, and Governor's budget proposals for each element align or differ. Below is the list of the conference committee members for each bill (now assigned only one bill number), with the name of the Chair of each body is listed in **bold**, and a brief summary of the elements related to early care and education.

E-12 EDUCTION CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEMBERS – HF 890

House Conferees: **Loon**, Erickson, Kresha, Bennett, Murphy M. **Senate Conferees**: **Nelson**, Pratt, Weber, Eichorn, Wiger

These bills include the following early education funding and policies: Voluntary Pre-kindergarten, ECFE, School Readiness, Head Start, Reading Corps, Early Learning Scholarships, Promise Neighborhoods/Transformation zones, After School Community Learning, Home Visiting, and Parent Aware as well as new proposals around creation/study of an Office of Early Education and Development.

HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEMBERS – SF 800

House Conferees: Dean; Schultz; Schomacker; Albright; Kiel **Senate Conferees: Benson**; Abeler; Housley; Utke; Lourey

These bills include the following early education funding and policies: Child Care Assistance, Child Care licensing/fraud prevention, Public Health Nurse and other Home Visiting, Crisis Nursery, Early Dental Services, and a data sharing pilot.

TAXES CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEMBERS - HF 4

House Conferees: Chamberlain, Dahms, Miller, Senjem, Rest

Senate Conferees: Davids, Drazkowski, McDonald, Hertaus, Marquart

These bills include the following early education funding and policies: Expansion of the Education expense credit to include Pre-K, changes to the Dependent Care Tax Credit, and Student Loan forgiveness for education professionals (including early care and education careers).

HIGHER EDUCATION CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEMBERS - SF 2214

These bills include the following early education funding and policies: Increase in funding and time of use for students with higher education child care grants, and a requirement postsecondary education institutions provide information to pregnant and parenting students.

JOBS CONFERENCE COMMITTEE MEMBERS – SF 1937

House Conferees: Miller, Dahms, Osmek, Anderson, Champion **Senate Conferees: Garafolo,** Newberger, Hoppe, O'Neil, Mahoney

These bills include the following early education funding and policies: YWCA job skills development program (focused on the CDA), child care business start-up and expansion grants, FATHER project funding, a women-run cooperative child care business pilot, and child care business training through WomenVenture.
