

Peacetime Emergency Child Care Grants

Round 1 Grant Awards Summary, May 14, 2020

Background

The grants, proposed by Gov. Tim Walz and authorized by the Minnesota Legislature last month, will support family child care providers and child care centers to ensure there are enough child care slots to serve families of critical sector workers during the state's COVID-19 emergency response. A total of \$29,694,000 was provided by the Minnesota Legislature to assist child care providers. Approximately \$9.75 million was allocated in Round One, from April 18 through May 18. Rounds two and three will occur in subsequent months.

Applicant Pool

Applications were accepted starting on April 1 – April 15, 2020. A total of 5,401 applications were received, or approximately 58% of the all DHS and Tribally licensed programs¹. By type, 84% of the applications were from family child care, and 16% were from child care centers, which is similar to the state breakdown of DHS licensed program types. By location, 37% of the applications were from programs in the Twin Cities Metro area.

Grant Awardees

A total of 1,287 programs (24% of applicants) were offered grant awards,² located in all Economic Development Regions, and 63 counties. By type, 78% of awardees are family child care programs, and 22% are child care centers. By location, 57% of the awarded programs were located in Greater Minnesota, and 43% were located in the Twin Cities Metro area. All programs were notified via the applicant email one week after initial awards were announced. Any funds outstanding after the closure of Round One will be added to the next grant round.

Amounts Awarded by Program Type and Geographic Area

At the end of Round One, \$9,757,500 had been distributed to 1,268 programs. Information is shown by geographic area and program type below.
