COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

- Jan. 30: The Senate Human Services Reform Committee met to review the Governor's DHS budget
- Jan. 31: The House Education Policy Committee reviewed MDE's "World's Best Workforce" report
- Feb. 1: The House Subcommittee on Child Care Access and Affordability received an overview of the child care regulatory system from DHS
- Feb. 1: The House Health and Human Services Finance Committee met to review the Governor's DHS budget
- Feb. 1: The Senate Human Services Reform Committee took public testimony on the Governor's DHS budget
- Feb. 2: The House Job Growth and Energy Affordability Policy and Finance Committee heard HF 315-the tax credits for parental leave bill which was passed and amended and referred to the Tax Committee
- **Feb. 2:** The **Senate Focus on Five and Under working group** continued with overviews on the WIC program, Home Visiting, Early Childhood Screening, and the Urban Indian Welfare act

COMMITTEE DEADLINES

- Friday, March 10: Committees must act favorably on bills in the house of origin
- Friday, March 17: Committees must act favorably on bills, or companion bills, that met the first deadline in the other house
- Friday, March 31: Committees must act favorably on major appropriation and finance bills
