COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

MONDAY, FEB. 13

- Senate Jobs & Economic Growth Finance & Policy Committee-Reviewed the Governor's budget
- Senate E-12 Finance Committee: SF 718 was heard and public testimony taken

TUESDAY, FEB. 14

- House Education Finance Committee: HF 646 was laid over for possible inclusion in the omnibus bill & HF 602 was passed and re-referred to the House Tax Committee
- House Higher Education & Career Readiness Policy and Finance Committee: HF 889 was heard
- House Job Growth Committee: HF 793 was laid over for possible inclusion in the omnibus bill

THURSDAY, FEB. 16

- House Education Policy Committee: HF 734 passed and re-referred to Education Finance
