This week's update provides an overview of the **House and Senate Health and Human Services bills** (see the bill tracker for more details on each bill)

HOUSE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OMNIBUS FINANCE BILL (HF 3467)

The following bills are included in whole or in part in the House bill:

- Hands Off Child Care Act adopted (HF 436)
- Child care assistance subsidy restrictions modified (HF 2470)
- Maternal depression screening and treatment grant program established, and pilot projects (HF 3419)
- Child care program governing provisions modified, legislative task force on child care created (HF 3433)
- Positive support strategy rule temporary exemption provided (HF 3495)
- Income and child development in the first three years of life demonstration project allowed (HF 3781)

More specifically, the bill does the following:

- Repeals Minnesota statutes related to child care provider unionization
- **Modifies child care assistance program maximum rates** for child care providers who are located within the boundaries of a city located in two or more counties
- Establishes a grant program to provide culturally competent screening and treatment for pre-and postpartum mood and anxiety disorders in pregnant women and women who have given birth in the last 12 months
- Establishes pilot projects to provide **substance abuse disorder treatment and services** to pregnant and postpartum women
- Instructs the commissioner to study the cost for development of a website for use by child care providers that would provide a **single point of access** for statutes and rules relevant to child care, how to start a child care business, and completing various applications
- Requires a county licensor who has conducted a licensing inspection to provide the licensee with written notification of potential licensing violations noted during the visit prior to departing the home
- Establishes an eight-hour **preservice training requirement for county licensors**, increases training and oversight of county licensors, and instructs the commissioner to provide annual notices to licensors and supervisors on new laws relating to family child care
- Requires the Commissioner of Human Services to create a full-time position to act as a **liaison and** advocate for child care providers
- Creates a Legislative task force to evaluate issues related to affordability and accessibility to child care
- Requires the commissioner to review and evaluate the applicability of the **positive support strategies** and restrictive intervention rules to child care providers, and exempts child care providers from certain rules until this process is complete
- Provides necessary exemptions for income and assets if Minnesota is chosen for the **federal "income** and child development in the first three years of life" demonstration project

SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OMNIBUS FINANCE ARTICLE

The following bills are included in whole or in part in the Senate bill:

- Basic sliding fee child care assistance program forecasted, and child care assistance provider reimbursement rates modified (SF 2562)
- Northstar Care for Children basic monthly rate modified (SF 2641)
- Early preventive dental intervention and care for infants and toddlers pilot program developed, and money appropriated (SF 2824)
- A bill for an act relating to human services; appropriating money for crisis nursery services (SF 2984)
- Minnesota Initiative Foundations funding provided, and money appropriated (SF 3049)
- Income and child development in the first three years of life demonstration project allowed (SF 3394)
- Governor's Health and Human Services supplemental bill (SF 3332)

More specifically, the bill does the following:

- Increases the current child care assistance reimbursement rate by 7%
- Amends the child protection payment formula to counties to retain the existing formula
- Requires the commissioner to develop a **statewide coordinated dental sealant program** to improve access to preventive dental services for school-age children and distribution of **dental screening promotional** materials in 5 high needs communities
- Allocates funds to the **Minneapolis Crisis Nursery** to continue efforts to prevent child abuse and neglect, and to develop practices that can be shared with organizations around the state
- Allocates funds to the Minnesota Initiative Foundations to increase access to affordable child care in greater Minnesota
- Transfers the responsibility to perform background studies on child care and legal nonlicensed child care providers from the county to DHS
- Requires the commissioner to work with community stakeholders to carry out a study identifying barriers, challenges, successes affecting initiation, duration and exclusivity of breastfeeding
- Provides necessary exemptions for income and assets if Minnesota is chosen for the **federal "income** and child development in the first three years of life" demonstration project
- Increases **the medical assistance payment** rates for prenatal and postpartum follow up **home visits** provided by public health nurses using evidence based models
- Requires the Department of Human Services to report on the **presence and cost of liability insurance** in Licensed Family Child Care homes (added in Finance Committee)
