

# **Legislative Update: May 17, 2016**

(Activity through Friday, May 13)

This update along with the Bill Tracker, will be posted each **Tuesday** (reflecting activity through the previous Friday) on the Child Care Aware of Minnesota website.

The primary activity was the start of the work by the Conference Committee on the supplemental budget bill (HF 2749). The initial meetings consisted of walking through the budget spreadsheets and the "side by sides" which provide a comparison of language in the House and Senate bills. Some additional testimony was also takenprimarily from Department staff who outlined the Governor's proposals/positions.

Hopefully we will see a final bill reflecting agreements on these items prior to the constitutional deadline of Monday, May 23. In the meantime, here is a combined/comprehensive summary of what is "in play":

# **TAX BILLS**

The **Senate Tax bill** was heard in committee and passed the Senate floor on **May 11 on a vote of 37-30.** The bill contains two provisions that could have impacts on families with young children:

- Working Family Tax Credit: Modifies the percentage of earned income on which the credit is calculated
  so that claimants at the lowest income levels would be eligible for larger credit amounts and the credit
  would extend to higher income levels. In addition, these levels are adjusted annually for inflation.
- Family and Medical leave: Creates an unpaid 12-week family care leave subject to the same requirements that exist for state mandated unpaid pregnancy and bonding leave. The bill also establishes an insurance benefit program for employees that would offer pregnancy benefits, bonding benefits, and family care benefits.

There has not yet been an omnibus Tax Bill heard in the **House** this session.

### **OTHER BILLS**

# The following bill was heard on the Senate floor, and passed on a vote of 45-13:

• Child care legislative task force created, and report to the governor required (SF 3208): The House companion to this bill was included in the House Omnibus HHS bill.

# The following bills have had a second reading and continue to await floor action:

- Human services data provisions modifications (SF 1434).
- Maternal depression screening and treatment grant program established, and pilot projects to provide treatment for pregnant and postpartum women with substance use disorders established (SF 3419):
