



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE / March 20, 2018

Welcome to the Child Care Aware Legislative Update. This narrative update, along with our Bill Tracker, will be posted each **Tuesday** (reflecting activity through the previous Friday) on the <u>Child Care Aware of Minnesota website</u>.

Each week we will provide a brief overview of bills that have been introduced, action that has been taken at the committee level or on the floor, and any other pertinent news related to **early care and education and school age care** issues.

OVERVIEW

On Wednesday, March 14, Governor Dayton gave his final State of the State address, signaling areas of focus for the last year of his administration. **On Friday, March 16**, he released his <u>proposed supplemental budget</u>. This proposal will now be under consideration as potential budget bills are crafted. Elements related to early childhood include the following:

EDUCATION

- **Voluntary Pre-K** The proposal allocates **\$204,000** for additional administrative capability in 2019, and an additional **\$57 million** in the 2020-21 biennium to sustain and extend the program.
- **Early Learning Scholarships** The proposal expands scholarships to infants and toddlers and extends use of existing funds across 27 months instead of 24 months but recommends no additional funding.
- Help me Grow The proposal allocates \$1.5 million in 2019 and an additional \$3 million for the 2020-21 biennium.
- **Head Start Background Checks** The proposal allocates **\$51,000** in 2019 and an additional **\$16,000** for the 2020-21 biennium.

HUMAN SERVICES

• **Child Care Assistance** – The proposal adds **\$2.5 million** in 2019 and an additional **\$15 million** in the 2020-21 biennium to expediate applications from homeless families and provide 12 months of coverage.

TAXES

• Working Family Tax Credit – The proposal increases the credit at the lowest income levels, expands the credit to include parents ages 21-24, and increases the maximum credit for those with three or more children.

- Thursday, March 22: Committees must act favorably on bills in the house of origin.
- **Friday, March 29:** Committees must act favorably on bills, or companion bills, that met the first deadline in the other house.
- Friday, April 20: Committees must act favorably on major appropriation and finance bills.
