



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE, February 23, 2021

Welcome to the sixth Child Care Aware Legislative Update of the 2021 Legislative session. This narrative update, along with our Bill Tracker, will be posted each Tuesday (reflecting activity through the previous Friday) on the Child Care Aware of Minnesota Website.

Each week we will provide a brief overview of bills that have been introduced, action that has been taken at the committee level or on the floor, and any other pertinent news related to early care and education and school age care issues. OVERVIEW

Several committees began the process this week of hearing bills and laying them over for possible inclusion in the omnibus bill. This is a common process for bills that do not need to move independently to the floor of the House or Senate.

These omnibus bills will be crafted in March, once the February budget forecast is out and the committees receive budget targets, letting them know how much they can spend.

COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

The following committees discussed these early care and education/school age care issues during the week of Feb. 15-19:

House Early Childhood Finance and Policy Committee

- **HF 5** (Pinto) COVID-19; state appropriations replaced with federal funds, child care providers public health support funds funding provided, basic sliding fee program. *Laid over for consideration*.
- HF 1024 (Pinto) Department of Early Childhood established, and rulemaking authorized. Passed and
- re-referred to Education Finance
- HF 910 (Kotyza-Witthuhn) Early childhood program participation required by children in foster care. Laid over for consideration.
- HF 668 (Wazlawik) Child care for children with disabilities access expansion grants. Laid over for consideration.

House Education Finance Committee

- HF 1064 (Davnie) Governor's Summer School Bill. Laid over for consideration.
- HF 587 (Murphy) Full-service community schools. Laid over for consideration.

House Labor, Industry, Veteran's and Military Affairs Finance and Policy Committee

• HF 357 (Koegel) Expanding applicability of pregnancy accommodations. Laid over for consideration.

- **S.F. 517** (Kiffmeyer) Child care providers administrative law procedures modification. *Bill Passed as amended and re-referred to Human Services Reform Finance and Policy*
- **S.F. 827** (Utke) Group family day care child-adult capacity ratios and age distribution restrictions modifications. *Bill Passed as amended and re-referred to Human Services Reform Finance and Policy*

- SF 237 (Cwodzinski) Preschool and kindergarten screen time limit. Laid over for consideration.
- **SF 788** (Chamberlain) Governor's Policy Bill Prekindergarten through grade 12 general education. *Laid over for consideration.*

Senate Higher Education Finance and Policy Committee

- **SF 526** (Koran) Black Men Teach Twin Cities grant authorized to increase the number of black male teachers. *Laid over for consideration.*
- **SF 797** (Abeler) Increase Teachers of Color Act in higher education strengthened, and student teacher grants and teacher shortage loan forgiveness provisions modified. *Laid over for consideration*.

Senate Human Services Reform Finance and Policy Committee

• **HF 60** (Koegel)Parental notice of and participation required in maltreatment determination reconsideration and human services licensing sanction appeal hearings. *Laid over for consideration*.

- **Friday, March 19** Committees must act favorably on bills, or companions of bills, that met the first deadline in the other body.
- Friday, April 9 Committees must act favorably on major appropriation and finance bills.
