



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE, March 30, 2021

Welcome to the eleventh Child Care Aware Legislative Update of the 2021 Legislative session. This narrative update, along with our Bill Tracker, will be posted each Tuesday (reflecting activity through the previous Friday) on the <u>Child Care Aware</u> of <u>Minnesota Website</u>.

Each week we will provide action that has been taken at the committee level or on the floor, a brief overview of bills that have been introduced, and any other pertinent news related to early care and education and school age care issues. Note: There will be no Legislative Update next week (April 6) due to the Legislative spring break.

OVERVIEW

Last week featured another flurry of committee hearings, many of which included overviews of elements in the <u>Governor's</u> <u>supplemental budget</u> and/or the soon to be released American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding and how it will impact the budgets of several agencies. ARPA includes significant funding for child care.

Now that the House and Senate budget targets have been released, work will begin behind the scenes to craft the committee omnibus bills, incorporating many of the bills that have been laid over for consideration in previous hearings. This work will begin in the committees once legislators return on Tuesday, April 6 from their week-long spring break. The final deadline for completion of these bills is Friday, April 9.

COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

- **HF 1268** (Richardson) Healthy development of babies during pregnancy and postpartum grant for black, indigenous, or people of color families funding provided. *Informational hearing only*

• HF 1081 (Richardson) Education Omnibus Policy Bill. Laid over

House Human Services Finance and Policy Committee

- **HF 1825** (Edelson) Human services background study disqualification statute task force established to review and recommend improvements. *Laid over*
- **HF 2127** (Schultz) *Governor's proposal* Children and family services, community supports, direct care and treatment, and chemical and mental health services provisions modified. *Laid over*

House Health Finance and Policy Committee

• **HF 2128** (Liebling) *Governor's proposal* Health care, human services, and licensing and background study provisions modified; health and human services budget established. *Laid over*

House Higher Education Committee

• **HF 993** (Bernardy) *Governor's proposal* Minnesota State Colleges and Universities, University of Minnesota, and the Mayo Clinic funding and policy changes provided; student aid programs modified; direct admission pilot program created. *Laid over*

• HF 7 (Olson, L.) Earned sick and safe time. Passed and sent to General Register

House Jobs and Economic Development Committee

- **HF 1342** (Noor) *Governor's proposal* Jobs and economic development established; funding provided for Departments of Employment and Economic Development. *Informational hearing only-no action taken*
- HF 1200 (Richardson) Paid Family Medical Leave. Laid over

Senate Human Services Reform Finance and Policy Committee

- **SF 795 (Murphy)** Child care assistance program disqualification for child care providers that rely upon representations of compliance prohibition. *Laid over*
- SF 297 (Abeler) Legislative Task Force on Human Services Background Study Eligibility creation. Laid over

Senate Health and Human Services Finance and Policy Committee

- S.F. 2155 (Coleman) Certifying organizations for doulas list modifications; doula registry governing provisions modifications. *Laid over*
- **SF 981** (Wiklund) *Governor's proposal* Human services miscellaneous provisions governing children and family services, community supports, direct care and treatment, health care, human services licensing, background studies, and chemical and mental health services modifications. *Laid over*
