



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE May 17, 2022

Welcome to the Child Care Aware Legislative update. The updates from the full session, along with our Bill Trackers, can be found on the Child Care Aware of Minnesota Website.

OVERVIEW

Last week was devoted to conference committee activity for "walk-throughs" of the House and Senate policy language and budget appropriations to familiarize committee members with each other's bills. The initial goal of the conference committee process is to identify language that is the same or similar to find common ground.

Because the amount of funding each body was given for their bills differs widely, committees must wait for new joint "targets" from leadership to decide on an amount they can spend, which will drive negotiations on final budget agreements. Hopefully, these targets will be shared this week, and committees can work to complete their negotiations.

HOUSE AND SENATE FLOOR ACTIVITY

On May 11, The Senate passed their Omnibus Tax bill (HF 3669-Nelson) on a vote of 42-22. The bill now moves to a conference committee with the House to work out a final bill for approval by both bodies. The bill includes credit for parental leave expenses, enhancements to child and dependent care credits, and K-12 credits and subtractions.
