



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE | FEBRUARY 28, 2023

Welcome to the latest Child Care Aware Legislative update. This narrative update, along with our Bill Tracker, will be posted each Tuesday (reflecting activity through the previous Friday) on the Child Care Aware of Minnesota Website.

Each week we will provide action that has been taken at the committee level or on the floor, a brief overview of bills that have been introduced, and any other pertinent news related to early care and education and school-age care issues. OVERVIEW

Due to last week's snowstorm, activity at the Capitol was suspended and all hearings and floor sessions were canceled as of Wednesday, February 22. A few hearings took place on Monday and Tuesday and some new bills were introduced during the first part of the week, which are outlined below.

The week of February 27 will bring the release of the "February Forecast," which will lay out the economic picture that will guide the final negotiations over the budget decisions for the remainder of the session. We will provide an overview of that information next week.

COMMITTEE ACTIVITY

Here are the committee discussions that took place during the week of February 20-24, 2023:

- The House Human Services Policy Committee heard HF 1198 (Hanson, J) Child care assistance expanded to
 certain families, grants and rules regarding children's mental health expanded and modified, transition to
 community initiative modified, mental health staff training requirements modified. The bill passed as amended and
 re-referred to the Children and Families Committee.
- The Senate Human Services Committee heard SF 2 (Mann) Paid family, pregnancy, bonding, and applicant's serious medical condition benefits establishment and appropriation. The bill passed as amended and re-referred to the Jobs and Economic Development Committee.
- The Senate Education Committee heard SF 1240 (Putnam) Support staff persons required for early childhood family education programs. The bill passed as amended and re-referred to the Education Finance Committee.
